

note:

the grey lines on the deck and rear are for scoring and folding.

the white circles should be pierced to let the mast go through. I use toothpicks, the white circles are not an indication of the size of the hole to be drilled you need to adapt to the exact mast.

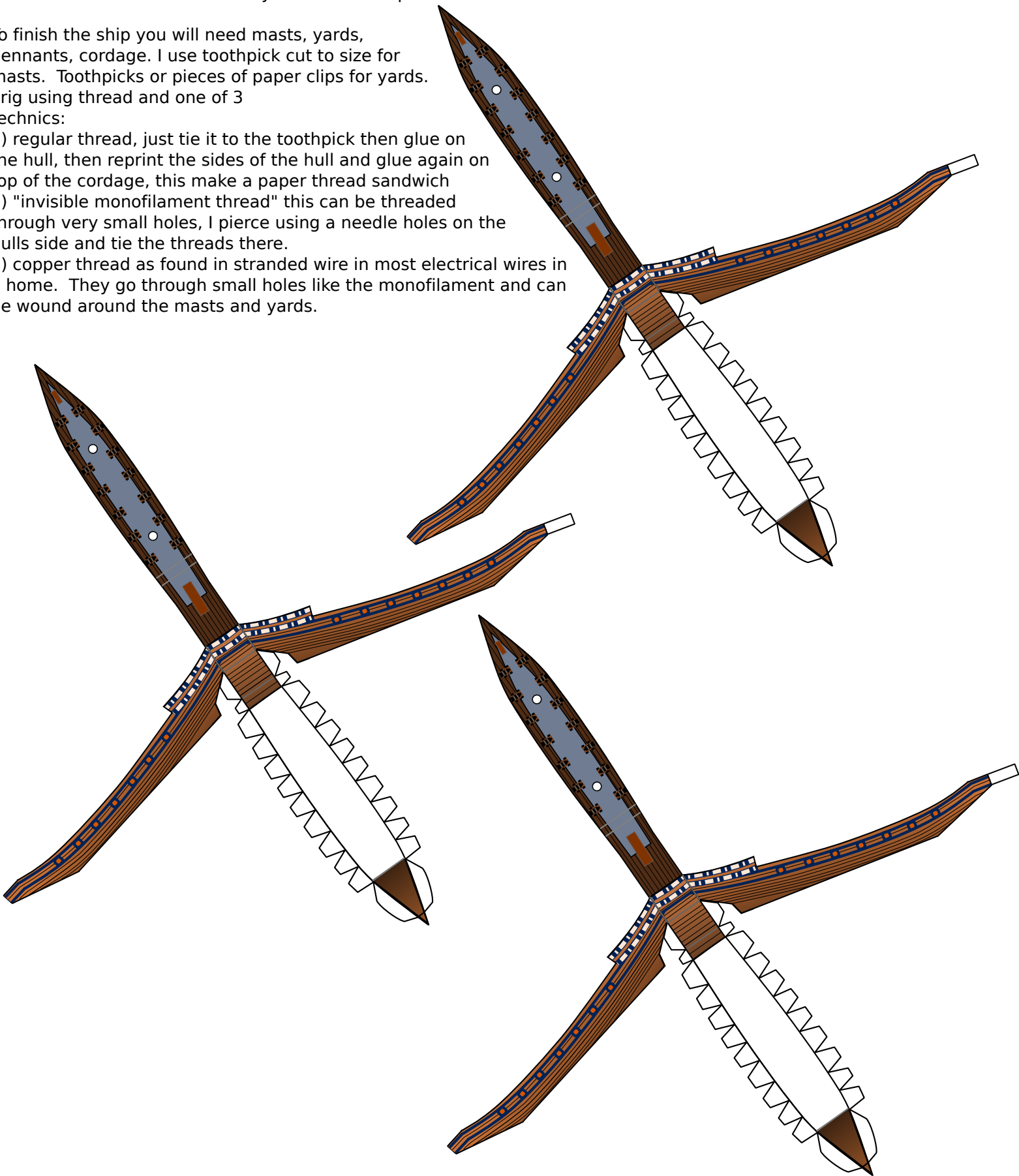
To finish the ship you will need masts, yards, pennants, cordage. I use toothpick cut to size for masts. Toothpicks or pieces of paper clips for yards. I rig using thread and one of 3

technics:

1) regular thread, just tie it to the toothpick then glue on the hull, then reprint the sides of the hull and glue again on top of the cordage, this make a paper thread sandwich

2) "invisible monofilament thread" this can be threaded through very small holes, I pierce using a needle holes on the hulls side and tie the threads there.

3) copper thread as found in stranded wire in most electrical wires in a home. They go through small holes like the monofilament and can be wound around the masts and yards.
